A Word from the Directors...

When Sala Garncarz left her home in October of 1940, she carried with her a few blank pages torn from her diary. Of all the things a sixteen-year-old girl might be thinking while preparing for six weeks in a forced labor camp, we can guess the significance of a few pieces of paper would not be among them. As weeks became years, however, pieces of paper – letters from loved ones – became the most significant things she had in her life.

While it is hard to imagine the suffering Sala and her fellow prisoners endured, it is easy to understand the way the power of the love of friends and family sustained them. Across the generations, across borders, across the divisions of class and race and sexuality, we are all united by a deep longing to be with the people we love. When we are separated, we seek connection with them.

Today, it is easy. We pick up the phone, send a text, dash off an email. Even if we have nothing in particular to say, we can check someone's social media accounts and know where they are, what they are doing and, often, how they feel about it. We freely share our stories and eagerly take in the stories of others, with technology making it effortless to preserve each one. Consider how far we have come in a handful of decades! Sala had only what was written on paper, in pencil or ink, and could preserve only what she could hide. She risked her life for 352 pieces of paper, her only fragile thread of connection to the beloved people whose continued correspondence gave her the hope to go on.

It is truly remarkable to think how far Sala's letters have traveled, through the world and through the years, to become the basis for this play. She could not have known, seventy-five years ago, that those diary pages she tucked away would come to hold a piece of her life story that would someday be played out on stage. She knew only what we all know, deep down that love must be shared and honored, and that our stories matter and must be told.

We who create theatre are, in essence, simply storytellers after all. The same questions with which characters wrestle in this play are the ones we face every time we begin a new production: what is the story, and how is it to be told? We are so grateful that Sala and her family ultimately decided to tell this story to the world. It has been an honor and a joy bringing Pascack Valley's theatre students together to tell it on our stage.
